## **New Acquisitions**

Recently, *HorsePower* has been lucky enough to obtain some exciting new items for our collection. This included the purchase of two very rare Napoleonic era weapons.

#### **1804 Pattern Cavalry Pistol**



Following complaints by the cavalry of the King's German Legion about the wooden ramrods of the Pattern 1799 Light Dragoon Pistol, the Board of Ordnance modified the design in 1804. Only 750 of the new pattern were made. Our example is marked "X LD E 80" indicating it was the 80th pistol of E Troop, 10th Light Dragoons. This shows the pistol came to the regiment between 1804 and 1806, when they were renamed Hussars.

#### **Paget Carbine**



The Paget Carbine was developed after problems arising from the previous cavalry carbine, particularly with the ramrod which was easily lost. The new weapon was light and easy to use whilst mounted, which made it popular amongst the soldiers. Our example is marked "K 50 XI LD", indicating it was the 50th carbine of K Troop, 11th Light Dragoons.

#### Lord Cardigan Memorabilia

*HorsePower* is building a fine Balaclava display which has been inspired by the recent acquisition of Lord Cardigan memorabilia. The KRH has loaned the Cardigan Ivory, a small but stunning portrait of Cardigan painted on ivory.

We also now have on loan a signed copy of one of his Crimea Campaign diaries and we are promised his personal campaign watch from a private donor, again on loan.



#### Sgt Shakespeare 11th Hussars

We have been lucky enough to receive the collection of Sgt Ivan Shakespeare from the Second World War. These included a variety of items from photograph albums, maps and even a bottle of

champagne rescued on the retreat to Dunkirk!
